4. BOROUGH COUNCILLORS REPORT

Mrs Hicks reported that there were approximately 1500 people on the housing list in Ashford, which is in line with the national average. ABC is hoping to purchase another property to increase the available housing stock.

Councillors discussed various planning issues with Mrs Hicks.

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A local farmer is keen to sell one of his fields to a developer for bungalows to help the young people in the area.

5. COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT

Councillor Angell reported that there was to be a full council meeting on 10 December, after which the budget would be discussed. He said he understood that good progress was being made with cutting the deficit to find the £80 million pounds that KCC needs to save next year. The majority of the money has now been returned from Iceland.

Mr Angell reported that he is has been in touch with the PROW officer regarding the bollards that have been cut away in Duck Lane. The cost of replacing them is going to be expensive so the officer is assessing the situation.

Residential development comprising 24 x 2 storey dwellings with all associated infrastructure and services

Too many houses for the size of the site

Inadequate parking – extra spaces needed to allow for visitors to the properties Another access being created onto Woodchurch Road, too close to the entrance to the Kings Head Public House

Poor site lines for traffic exiting the development

The Green Area serves no purpose for the majority of the residents of Shadoxhurst and appears to be designed so that it will flood in heavy rain, suggesting that the existing and proposed surface water drainage system is inadequate.

Who will maintain the Green Area?

Loss of biodiversity

The sewerage system in the village will not cope with the extra houses

Loss of permissive footpaths

Loss of village amenity

Councillors are disappointed that the developer did not take up the advice of Ashford Borough Council and arrange to meet with the local community.
