Parade and Service on Remembrance Day



The Shadoxhurst Church clock was installed as the World War One village memorial, but no plaque was ever placed on it. Therefore, for the Armistice Centenary, villagers raised some £800 this autumn for a memorial plaque for the clock. The local History Group found the names of four soldiers from the village who died,

whose names are now remembered for posterity on a fine slate roundel.

The plaque was dedicated at the Remembrance Service in the church on 11th November by Canon Gilbert Spencer. Members of the local Scouting, Cub, Beaver and Ark Drama 2000 Groups were present and involved. It was felt to be a very moving and fitting service on this important anniversary. (Words by Rev. Planning News

Many of you will know by now that the outline planning application for 'Delcroft'

on Woodchurch Road was granted at the November ABC Planning Committee. This was a great blow particularly to those residents who live close by. There was a split vote and the casting vote went to the Chairman who approved it. A second planning application to approve the final design and various reserved matters is expected to be submitted. The development north of Farley Close will go to appeal, we have no details yet.

Public Consultation

You are invited to an important meeting and exhibition in the Village Hall on Sunday 13th January.

We would like your views on three key issues, two of which involve large prospective developments in our village, the other is part of an ABC consultation about planning policies and the 'confines' of our village. It will be a **drop-in event between 10.00 – 3.00**, but at **11.00am** and **2.00pm** the Parish Council will do a presentation to explain the three situations. We want your comments.

Please do come along as we are trying to influence and shape our village but to do this effectively, we need your views. It will be an opportunity to meet Parish Councilors and tell them what is important to you and your family.

Do you want us to stay a village, or become a suburb of Ashford? What do you want for Shadoxhurst? Please take some time to come and see us and tell us what you think on **Sunday 13th January.** Tea and coffee will be available.

Neighborhood Watch (NHW) Update

Reports continue to appear on social media of suspicious activity around the village. Most recently a red Fiesta, with two occupants, has been seen parked along local roads with two male occupants walking some distance approaching properties under the apparent pretext that they are looking to deliver a letter. Once spotted they have rapidly moved off.

Please be vigilant of cars parked not obviously associated with a property and people moving around the area without an obvious legitimate purpose. If you have concerns please report your observations to the Police, warn your neighbours using the Social network sites (Facebook, Nextdoor) and consider speaking directly with your neighbours. Working together we are stronger and have a better chance of deterring unwelcome activity.

As if dealing with actual activity in the village is not enough, we are all at risk of cyber criminals who are active, trying to obtain personal and financial details to help with their activities. There have been numerous reports of people receiving texts, emails and calls from companies

asking for updates to personal bank details, make payments because a direct debit could not be collected from your bank (the TV licence is one in particular), or offering a large payment in exchange for a small payment from you.

It is unlikely that your bank will approach you by email to update your details – if you are unsure ALWAYS check with them BEFORE making any submissions. Use a bill or statement for contact numbers – not anything quoted in emails or texts.
