Speedwatch



News

The Shadoxhurst Speedwatch Team started their monitoring in mid June. There are 10 approved locations within the village – covering the main routes and vehicle travel directions e.g. Church Lane, Woodchurch Road, Hornash Lane and Tally Ho Road. Activities have been undertaken on all roads although Tally Ho Road and Hornash Lane have seen most activity due to the high volume of speeding vehicles observed.

Of the first 19 sessions for which information has been uploaded, over 4,600 vehicles have been monitored of which 735 have been identified as exceeding the limit by 5mph or more. The average speed of those offenders has been consistently at close to 40mph – that's the average! The last 5 sessions have seen about a quarter of offenders being in excess of 40mph.

The highest speed recorded so far has been 62 mph – with 50+mph not being unusual in any given session.

We need to continue with activities to reduce the number of people who continue to ignore the speed limit and put themselves and villagers at risk, to this end we would welcome more volunteers to help run sessions. Gardening Club

Four meetings have been held to date with circa 12 "members" from across the village on the books. We're an informal gathering of those with an interest and differing levels of experience in gardening. We are looking to help each other with day to day issues experienced with plants, planting, pests and planning.

At this stage we're not looking to arranging group visits but to find possible sites to visit and then organise within the group travel for those who wish to attend. Coming up will be discussions around end of season activities and then look at how to protect plants over the winter period e.g. by placement if within pots, taking cuttings or keeping in a warmer area. Next year planning will include sharing seed purchases rather than each buying a packet with excess seeds.

Also looking at holding some group meetings at members properties to see practically the challenges and successes they have worked with.

Planning News

1. The land at the rear of Brinklow Bungalow will at some point be going to the Planning Committee for a decision. The application is for 34 new dwellings for those aged over 55 only.

The Parish Council has objected to the scheme and the comments are now uploaded on the ABC website. The ABC reference number is 19/00806/AS, there is still time to make comments.

2. An early warning that a new application will soon be put in to ABC for the field to the rear of Farley Close. The previous application was for 21 houses, but in the appeal against the previous refusal, the Planning Inspector upheld the refusal but required more affordable housing. Now there will be 22 houses proposed in much the same layout, but with 9 affordable dwellings. Look out for details in due course.

Sewing Club

The Sewing Club recently celebrated its second anniversary with a glass of wine. I don't think much sewing took place after that! If you wish to join the Sewing Club to help with community projects or work on your own projects with a little help from other members or wish to sit, knit or crochet or work on any other craft, they meet every fortnight on a Thursday evening (7pm-9pm) in the Village Hall. **August meetings are 8th and 22nd and September meetings are 5th and 19th**

Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) Update

The latest data from the Police indicate a small number of incidents in May – although not items which affect the majority of the village. There was vandalism in the Recreation field, with damage being done to one of the swing seats, although thankfully we seem to have escaped any further damage by stones being fired at property.

Outside of the village there continue to be cases of thefts from vehicles and outbuildings – please continue to protect your belongings by locking them out of sight to remove the likelihood of opportunistic theft.

We do have a fire damaged property along Hornash Lane which has yet to be repaired – please keep an eye on any suspicious activity around the site/area until the property is made fully secure. Remember concerns / observations can be either phoned through to the Police using 101, logged via their website of anonymously via CrimeStoppers on 0800 555 111.

If you would like to help the Police in a pro-active manner, they are now recruiting for Police Support Volunteers. Some examples of what the role includes are:

- helping with local policing
- assisting front counters
- Neighbourhood Watch support
- general administration, such as updating databases, supporting CID and other departments.
- role-playing during police training

Volunteers must:

- be over 18 years old
- have more than three years' permanent and continuous UK residence
- live or work in Kent

Ashford Borough Update

The two new Borough Councilors are now some three months into their four year term and have been busy with cases referred to them from all four villages and parishes they represent. The Planning Committee meets each month and George sits on that. At the first one in May, an application at Warehorne for 50+ houses was deferred for improvements and more infrastructure research. At the most recent meeting, an application in Hamstreet for 80 houses and a 60 bed care home was also deferred for similar reasons. David and George spoke to influence the Members present at both.

The two decisions were correct. Both sites are destined for housing as the sites are allocated in the Local Plan. Getting the design and layout right as well as knowing the services and roads can cope with the extra houses and families is vital. This gives hope that all applications will not just be rubber stamped for approval if there are serious concerns to be overcome.
