Defibrillator Instructions

We have been asked to remind residents about the defibrillator situated at the village hall and advise on how to use it. Essential as when we come to use it in earnest, there is already a problem to be solved and time is vital.

The important thing is that there is a code to open the door. The instructions on the outside (see photo) refer to ringing 999 for medical assistance and at the same time obtaining the door code as the interim measure.

On training events we have been reminded that continuous CPR is the only way to try to resuscitate someone, and the defibrillator is there to help this process until the medical professionals arrive, as CPR is extremely hard work.

Once the machine is out, simply follow the instructions which are voice led and you can't go wrong. It won't work if the machine detects a pulse, so cannot be misused if someone's heart has restarted. We have provided it as an essential back up and we hope you won't have to use it,

but if there was a problem, it is easy to use, simply following the instructions.



Annual Spring Clean

On Saturday 21st March we will again have our Spring Clean event as part of the **Great British Spring Clean**. It will hopefully include some vegetation trimming and tidying, not just litter picking.

We are blessed that Michael generally looks after the village roads when he can. Where else is support needed to tidy/remove debris? We are looking for suggestions for locations and volunteers. Parish News

We are continuing to make improvements to the village hall to make it more attractive for hiring and use. This includes some new cushioned chairs, crockery and cutlery. These were put to good use with the recent Murder Mystery event which was fully booked and raised over £480.

Hornash House

The planning application for Hornash House, Hornash Lane was recently refused by ABC. There is a lot of concern about the deterioration of the house itself following the two fires in 2019. The tarpaulin protecting the holes in the roof keeps being dislodged in the wind allowing rain in. We continue to remind the ABC Conservation Officers to be vigilant about ensuring the long term protection and stability of one of the oldest houses in the village.

GreenVolt and Tally Ho Road

We recently held a drop-in for residents to talk about the likelihood of a new planning application on Tally Ho Road. The company sent a new proposed layout, and it was a good opportunity to talk face to face about people's concerns. We did an information sheet explaining the current position and residents took away a comments sheet.

Some completed them at the event. But at publication date, we still await the return of the comments sheets from others.

Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) Update

Regular updates are posted on the two village Facebooks sites ("Shadoxhurst Community" and "Shadoxhurst, a Kent village") and the Nextdoor website.

The recurring hot topic for villagers are people attempting to "Scam" – pretending to be a legitimate company seeking financial details which will then be used to extract money. Many will have received a call purporting to be from the likes of BT or Amazon saying that action is needed to keep your telephone line or account open. Do not respond to such calls – simply terminate the call. Within Kent there is a known case where the call was supposedly from the Police investigating a member of Bank staff and asking for cash to be withdrawn and handed to a courier. The Police would never ask for this to be done.

If you are unsure about any contact, be it on your doorstep, telephone or email please refer to a family member, friend or neighbour before any money or bank details are handed over. If you've not asked to be contacted be wary and not afraid to say "no" – put down the phone or close the door. Be particularly wary if there is more than one individual as they may try to distract you to gain access to your property. Call the Police via 999 if you feel threatened or the people refuse to leave.

We have had two recent example of doorstep collectors for charities (Kent Air Ambulance & Alzheimer's Research UK) – while both appear to have been legitimate, I would advise against providing anyone who calls at your door with your bank / credit card details. If you would like to donate to such causes then I suggest you do so direct with the group rather than via a third party.

20th Dec – 30th Dec 2019 – Hornash Lane (Lead from around windows).

Anti-social behaviour - The recreation field is showing signs that a motorbike has been present on and around the field – if you see any activity that is causing damage to the field then please report it to the Police or Parish Council so that action can be taken.
